ASBURY: Signs by George Jensen

I am happy to announce that many home owners have made a great effort in cleaning up and sprucing up their properties. But there are still numerous residents who will have to be encouraged to get in the swing and join in the community spirit of cleaning up.

The Boro Employees, also, have worked hard in giving our streets a much needed facelift. Leaves, raked into the streets, by homeowners have been cleaned up, troublesome curbs cleaned with shovel and lots of elbow grease.

POLICE

Our Headquarters has been giving a much needed facelift inside the premises. Walls and ceilings have been painted, and the front (main-door) has been repaired.

I presume, that all of you have noticed the very impressive sign hanging over the front main entrance. I think, C.E. T.A. employee, Mr. George Jensen deserves our vote of thanks for a job well done. Signs in accordance with Borough Ordinance Regulation are now being readied by Mr. Jensen, and soon as they are completed will be posted in different location at our recreation facilities.

New Garbage cans have been placed at various locations to help keep the recreational areas clean.

I have asked the Superintendent to look into the feasibility leave benches made and installed (bolted down) all around inside Central Ave. Beach Pavillion. Curbs there will also be repainted and stenciled.

OLSON: We have tentative prices for the graph - flow meters for on water pump as required by the state. They came to \$2140 - and \$2480 - which is considerably cheaper than originally estimated by an engineer. The necessary paperwork is being done for bids purposes.

Our two water pumps can be paralleled for greater output. The second pump will only kick in as needed. We will have to get a price on necessary elected changes for added load capacity.

We have about 6 to 8 fire hydrants to replace which we are in the process of getting a tentative price on and which will go out to bid as soon as the preliminary work is completed.

There are many things other than this that have to be done on our water system --- some shut off valves --- looping of water lines etc. All this takes time as it is of such a highly specialized nature that much preliminary work has to go into it before bids can be prepared and made into the necessary ordinances. Its almost like where do you begin first so please be patient.

The county no longer does road strifing so we will probably have to get our own attachment for this. I understand it will be about a hundred dollars.

At our work meeting I was requested to bet gas bid estimates. It is a good way to get laughed at -- like where

have you been these last few years?? I could only suggest putting something in the papers to the effect of requesting a bid. Of course no one will answer but our Lord & Master in Treton may be off eased by it. Frankly I have more realistic worries than this.

Today I again contacted the Ocean County Mosquito Commission regarding our stream problem. They apologized for being very busy but will try to meet with me near the end of the week and look at Dillion Creek.




