MR. DeWITT ROMELL: Brought down as a child in the early days of this century, and have lived a part of each season at Island Heights in a cottage that my grandparents and parents owned. Now, Island Heights was founded just 100 years ago as a Methofist Camp Meeting Ground and Community and it has always been thought of in that connection. It seems to me that the Methodist Camp Meeting Ground wheather you are Methodist, Episcopalian, Roman Catholic or non-religious affiliates at all should be preserved as part of the hertiage of Island Heights. We don't have any large parks except that, and it has always been the supposition. I think, among all of us that it belonged to the community.

About 10 years ago much to my surprise I received in the mail a communications; I can't recall from whom, saying as a tax payer an owning property and it was in my deed that I had an interest in the Methodist Camp Meeting Ground, and would I be willing to forego that and have it sold. I rather (?) briskly replied that I would assume to sell myself for better porriage than to part with the Methodist Camp Grounds. And think the matter was felt that way by many because it was shelved for 10 years and my way of thinking it had been shelved for good; until this matter came up and I think that many of the older people feel the same way that this is part of our hertiage. I know we need money, practily all communities do I know that in New York, we need money, but we wouldn't think of selling Prospect Park or Central Park for building bonds.

MR. OLTON: I have mixed emotions about it amd I am not saying that we should or should not sell Camp Meeting Grounds. However, I did hear a suggestion that I think the Council might consider; and that was that we sell the portion that is south, the south portion for a park and this would give us revenue and it would mean that someone would go in there and try and stop the erosion that we are having now on that ground. Now, as I say, I am not making this a suggestion I am saying that I have heard this suggestion made and I would like to pass it on for your consideration.

MAYOR SALADINO: Thank you Mr. Olton. I have also heard that same recommendation, I think it is something that Council should take under consideration depending on how the voters of this community feel when they act on this. I am sure that is what it will come to if Council approves it tonight.

Does anybody feel that the Council is doing wrong by offering this to voters to act on in the community. Do you feel that we are doing wrong by that? Does anybody object to the Council getting this complete issue to everybody in the Borough of Island Heights. Not just the group that opposes it.

MAYOR SALADINO: That would be up to council to decide.

MRS. MURPHEY: The first thing that I realize about that is that there doeseem to be some confussion as to the legality of that you may be setting up an unreasonible process because there still is some effort to clarify your right to sell it because of the 30 outstand quick-claim deeds, 30 or 40 and if those deeders command that they have not been turned over to the Borough then I haven't got clear answer on how you have the right to offer that property.

MAYOR SALADINO: We have gone through a search, a 60 year search, on this property it is a legal search and this search says to us

that we may sell this piece of property. Nobody has shown us other wise that we do sell this piece of property.

MRS. MURPHEY: There are people right here that are holding- that still hold the rights tothat property.

MAYOR SALADINO: Nobody has ever shown that to us. I assume, from what I understand that there are deeds flotting around or in progession of people in the Borough of Island Heights that say they have restriptions for that camping grounds. But from what I can assotain. I have been trying to find out to do this thing properly these deeds are unrecorded deeds. One person said probably the reason they never recorded these deeds was toavoid paying taxes on this piece of property. Now, I son't know how true that is . The property is decided to the Borough.

MR. ZURLO: May I interupt for a moment Please?

MAYOR SALADINO: Yes you may.

MR. ZURLO: These deeds are recorded they are a matter of record it wasn't for tax reasons not to record them. They are recorded. If I may complement Mr. DeWitt over here he happens to process one which is public record in the Toms River Court House.

Assessment roughly\$75,000 damages was taken into consideration and will contact us in the future to added assessments to that figure. In regard to suite of Board of Education vs. The Borough of Island Heights Docket #141-76 I received a letter from Mr. Burke, the Commissioner of Education. The \$4800.00 which was cut by the Mayor and Council from the school budget for the lunch program was held up in favor of the Borough of Island Heights and we will not have to pay that to the Board. Mr. Burke claims Island Heights Board had \$28,019.00 that remains in unappropriated current and feels sufficient funds are there for the \$4800.00 to be taken from there.

Mayor Biggs stated that our representative at Central Regional High School, David Siddons, asked to make a report regarding Central Regional at this time.

Mr. Siddons urged the governing body to oppose the recent action of the local school Board supporting the proposed withdrawal of the three towns from the Central Regional School District. Mr. Siddons called the local Board's action "ill-advised and irrational Referring the local Board's action in asking the Point Pleasant system to accept local students in the event withdrawal from Central Regional is accomplished, Mr. Siddons said the Board should have made some preliminary determination before the request was made to Point Pleasant. Mr. Siddons indicated that if Seaside Park, Seaside Heights and Lacey Township are allowed to withdraw from Central Regional, the school will remain on double session, and that withdrawal will cost the local taxpayers more money, stating the Borough would pay approximately \$1,800.00 per student to Point Pleasant, plus transportation costs, whereas under full funding of T & E, the cost at Central Regional will be \$986.00.

Mr. Siddons said many of the problems being reported at Central Regional have been manufactured by the press. "The Central Regional Board is working hard to get the school on single session and are attempting to give students a good education at a reasonable cost."

Mr. Gorby, Borough Auditor, arrived at 7:45P.M.

Attorney Walsh said he believed there was a legal matter in regard to this matter. I have been served with a Petition requesting withdrawal from Lacey Township, Seaside Park and Seaside Heights. I have to give them some kind of an answer.

Mr. Saladino reported that Shur Heat Oil Co. would supply us with no-lead gas. Laurel Pump is to be contacted and Wes Wilber thought we could purchase one for under \$50.60. Wes said he thought they could bury the tank at least 3 feet below the surface from the top of the tank, near the garage.

Mr. Van Duyne stated all cars could use no-lead gas. Mr. Saladino stated he had checked on this and said Sun Oil Co. stated they do not recommend using it in older cars. It could burn up the valves. COUNCIL MEETING March 25, 1977

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Biggs at 7:36 P.M. at the Main Hall in the Borough Complex.

Reading of the Sunshine Law-Open Public Meeting Act., Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 (Section 10:4-10)

Pledge to the flag was followed by a silent prayer.

ROLL CALL:

Mr. Saladino, Mr. Hærnon, Mrs. King, Mr. Punderson, PRESENT: Mr. Stocco, Mr. Wood, and Mayor Biggs.

ABSENT: None

Also present were Attorney Walsh and Auditor George Gorby.

Mayor Biggs opened the Public Hearing on the 1977 Budget,

Phil Goyde of the REPORTER questioned if there were any Emergency allegations of fuel supplies for the coming winter. Mayor Biggs replied No, adequate amounts had been allowed under different department, other expense.

MR. DE CAMP questioned Source of Revenue-Anticipated Revenue-Interest on Investments and Deposits. 1977 Anticipated \$5,200.00, in 1976 \$8,600.00; and received \$5,239.60 in cash in 1976. Tell me pacifically where this money comes from.

MR. GORBY answered that the monies not immediately needed for operating costs are invested in certificates of deposits or in savings accounts and this is the interest received on that money.

If \$100,000. was invested at 5.2% would MR. DECAMP:Question! it have to be for the full twelve months?

MR. GORBY: Not necessarily as it does vary. Certain times

more is invested - other times less.

MR. DE CAMP: Are you reasonably certain they will receive thi

amount of money at the end of 1977?

MR. GORBY: The budget is based on the ex perience of last yes As you can see, last year we anticipated \$8,600.00 and only realize \$5,239.60. For that reason, this year we are only anticipating \$5,200.00. We have nothing lese to go by.

MR. DE CAMP: Go back to the Balance sheet of December 31,197 cash and investments shows here as \$202,00.00. In 1975, there was \$271,000,00, which would indicate a cash of which you are going to receive interest as approximately \$70,000 less than the year to produce this \$5,239.

MR. GORBY: At that particular moment-yes. It would depend on the liabilities-bills that had not yet been paid as/of December 31, 1976 and may have been paid in January or early February.

MR. DECAMP: You couldn't prove interest during the course of the year on 30 day or 60 day notes over the periods of time when To repeat-can you give me any assurance you have excess money. that there will be \$5200. here, in interest, at the end of the year

MR. GORBY; No, we can't quaratee that at this particular time because, first of all, we have no way of knowing what interest rates are going to do. Interest rates might double-we might collect twi Interest rates may drop and we'll collect less. Thats a calulated risk that we take in all these anticipated revenues. You can't quantee any of them except certain pacific ones that come from the State and that money has already been appropriated.

MR. DECAMP: If you had a Certificate of Deposit-the rate would already be on it, unless you cash it in and purchased another one. How would the rate change?

MR. GORBY: These notes are 30day or 60 day. Rate changes eve time.

MR. DECAMP: Not long term notes?

MR. GORBY: We do not have long term notes.

MR. GUDE questioned the notation "School and County taxes have not bee determined at this date". Is there any way to arrive at a rate that the residents of Island Heights will have to pay per hundred?

MR. GORBY: We are not quoting a rate at this time- NO. That is the reason for the notation. School elections have not taken place yet, County budget has only been adopted in the last few days We have not received any further information.

MR. DECAMP: I have another question-under Sanitation. In 1976 you had \$17,790, now in this year you have \$280000 and your total as modified by all transfers for 1976 is \$19,040. That is a substantial increase in the sanitation -garbage removal contract. Would you tell me just when that started?

MR. GORBY: The figure is exactly the same. The only different is last year we took credit for a trade-in on old borough equipment and put the net amount in. We're spending the same amount. The

contract is the same.

MR. DECAMP-Jack, I'm glad you did. Now let me ask a question. When I see this in the budget it annoys me. We got a \$10,000 increase Now if I could have gone back through a revenue item and picked up a sale or trade-in on a truck on this it would have shown me exactly what transpired. It would appear this was just held back for a year because this year, you don't have this \$8,000. some odd doltar trade in, so you have to show the total amount or at least the amount which will take in consideration the contract as well. Is there any reason Jack why it wouldn't be done this way?

MR. GORBY: Yes, I recommended it so I should defend it. At

Budget time the points you raise now were brought up. In order to anticipate the revenue would have meant passing a Resolution requesting the Director of Local Government to grant a special item of revenue to off set the \$28,000. that should have been in there last year. Your always in danger, that special permission not be granted. We would have been faced with an additional \$10,00 in last years budget. By doing it this way, we didn't have to ask anyones permission and we arrived at exactly the same answer. So it was my recommendation we do it the shorter and surer way. That's all there was to it.

MR. DECAMP: Then that is very minilar to what you are doing this year on the Resolution on the sale of lots. Isn't it? Aren't

there line items on the sale of lots?

MR. GORBY: Yes the same thing we had last year where we anticipated collecting payments on the sale of property.

MR. DECAMP: Two different properties-didn't do it last year

with the garbage but are this year.

MR. GORBY: Different situations-here we had contracts and

last year we din't have the money in hand yet.

MR. DECAMP: Well- sounds like a lot of money and not in keeping with what we were paying for trash and garbage removal in town! Well, that doesn't effect you Jack and I'll take that up another time.

Mr. Saladino: Mr. De Camp- Do you know how muchit cost the borough to collect trash and garbage before we went into this Contract?

MR. DECAMP: Well, from the Budget you hve in your hand, Yes. In 1976 \$19,024. and in 1976 add the \$8,000 for truck. Around 18,000. in budget back.

MR. SALADINO: Did you include sanitary landfill, cost of garbage truck depreciation, insurance costs, maintance ete.?

MR. DECAMP: What ever was under sanitation including salaries

MR. SALADINO: It was figured out with the accountant and form Treasurer, Mrs. Wilberscheid, that it was costing this borough between \$34,000 and \$36,000. for garbage and trash removal the old way before we entered into contract for \$28,000. So it is a saving for the borough of approximately \$7,000. Also \$12,00. in repairs

MR. DECAMP: Where would this money show in the Budget? MR. SALADINO: You would have to go back to former budgets.

MR. WALSH- 1975 is the last year this Borough had a borough

MR. DECAMP: OK, lets do that. 1975 paid or charged \$14,987. Salaries and wages. Other expenses was \$4,112.00 and Sanitary landfill \$4,000. Which makes it \$24,000.

MR. SALADINO: Would you add \$1,000 a truck per year-gas, oil tires, maintance etc. and you'll find it comes to right around \$34,000. The garbage contract was a great savings to the Borough of Island Heights.

MR. WOOD: The insurance alone was about \$750. Workmen's

Compensation too.

MR. SALADINO: Insurance rates were high on the garbage truck MR. DECAMP: Question on Current Fund Balance sheet Mr. Gorby \$19,000. shool taxes deferred in 1974. Have you made plans to remove that?

MR. GORBY: We will remove that when we have an extra good

year.

MR. DECAMP: Do you know off hand why that was put there?
MR. GORBY: Yes, I do! Because we had a very poor year and
we would have had a deficit which would have required this much
money put in the following year as a line ite. So rather than do
that we choose to use this method, which is proper and has been
approved. We've done this before and the figure has been higher &
lower.

MR. DECAMP: To remove this

MR. GORBY: Using Profit and loss statement

MR. DECAMP- One more question had asked the attorney about \$70,000 note which was paid off from General Current account. Is the General Current Account holding that note and if so when do we have to pay it back?

MR. GORBY; In fact, the monies were borrowed from the Bank were returned to the bank. The \$70,000 will still have to be raised by taxation to clear the Ordinance, the secondary ordinance to make this building possilbe.

MR. DECAMP: Ordinance of that type-any period of time-Bond

and interest-I'm thinking off.

MR. WALSH: Borough paid itself.

MR. GORBY: Yes-but it will have to go through budget.

MR. GORBY said the Budget was introduced at the regular meeting of February 25, 1977 and advertised in March 10th issue of the Observe Sent to the Director of Local Government and in going over they found a few items at 2:00P.M. today, a few items to be amended before this Budget may be adopted.

We feel that the responses to our questions show that Borough Council and the Planning Board should throughly study the Complex problem-Pros and cons plus possible land use. We feel the survey shows a large feeling to see the Complex. The move to buy this property was done in a hurry and we do not feel it should be sold in the same manner. Much investigation is needed to determine the best possible land use. Proper zoning and restricting is also needed before this land could be sold. To place a question on the ballot now, would be putting the cart befor the horse.

Our committee is turning this controversy back over to Council and the Planning Board for their study and investigation. After the study is completed and before a town vote is held, we would suggest that a Town Meeting be held so that all voters could hear the issues. pro and con, before casting their ballot."

MAYOR BIGGS spoke regarding the Master Plan after he had thanked the committee for a job well done. Mayor Biggs also remarked about the controversy that was going on when he first came here as Pastor in 1970. As our new budget figures show, there is new legislation which has been mandated.

#### ORDINANCE NO 77-6

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A REFERENDUM ON THE QUESTION OF THE ABOLITION OF THE LOCAL LIBRARY SYSTEM AND PARTICIPATION IN THE COUNTY-LIBRARY SYSTEM.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF ISLAND HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

l. The Borough Clerk shall cause the following question to appear on the ballot for the general election of Tuesday, November 8, 1977:

"Shall the free public library heretofore established in the Borough of Island Heights pursuant to Sections 40:54-1 to 40:54-29 of the Title, Municipalities and Counties of the Revised Statutes, be abolished, in order that the Borough of Island Heights may fully participate in the County Library system?"

- 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication pursuant to law.

Mayor Saladino said he was proud to be the Mayor and thanked everyone for their votes. Mayor Saladino requested that everyone come to Council meeting, as did Mr. Buckley and the rest of the Council.

Meeting was adjurned by Mayor Saladino at 12:50 PM.

Elsiemae Mc Carthy Borough Clerk Meeting called to order by Mayor Saladino at 7:45 P.M. in the Main Hall of the Borough Complex.

All requirements of the SUNSHINE LAW Open Public Meeting Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 Section 10:4-10 have been met.

Pledge to the flag and a silent prayer.

ROLL CALL:

PRESENT: Lisa Asbury, John Buckley, Florence Kernaghan, David Olson, James Punderson III, Mayor Joseph Saladino. ABSENT: Paul Murray

Mayor Saladino introduced members of the Ocean County Sewerage authority- Mr. Michael Gritzuk, William Fine and David Siddons. Mayor Saladino requested the meeting with the Ocean County Sewerage Authority so the new Councilmembers would have knowledge about the CENTRAL SERVICE AREA.

Mr. Gritzuk asked what specific questions did Mayor and Council have, and Mayor Saladino replied he would likethe following answered:

1. Where are we as far as contracts are concerned?

2. When will the Authority take over?

3. Cost Factor in reference to the Borough residents

4. Possible take over of the existing plant.

5. Financial transaction

Mr. Walsh said no money has been received on the resolution of four or five months ago on the small easement running across Toms River, Dillions Creek, adjacent pice of the sewer plant.

Mr. Gritzuk said the CENTRAL SERVICE AREA will go into service by late 1978. CENTRAL SERVICE AREA East of the Parkway is now in construction, and is presently 45% complete. The Authority has established a bulk rate of \$625.00 per million gallon of normal domestic sewerage discharged to the regional system. Authority is a wholesaler and it will be up to the Borough to reflex that back to the homeowner. Every municipality will be charged the bulk rate of \$625.00 per million gallon whether you are Southern, Northern or Central.

Mr. Saldino questioned whether the Borough would have to collect from the residents and pay the Authority on a quarterly basis.
Mr. Gritzuk replied yes- sometime in November a preliminary estimate charge based on volume anticipated flow times \$625.00 which equals the amount due December 1978. In January 1979, an annual charge notice will be sent which will show a deficiency notice for 1978 and the 1979 charge. In 1979 there will be no change in the bulk rate charge.

Mr. Punderson questioned the Authority's estimate of the gallonage Island Heights would use. Mr. Gritzuk did not have a gallonage. Mr. Fine said 140,00 gallons per day.

A discussion followed on how the \$625.00 per million gallon figure was arrived at.

There is a letter in the file from Ocean County Sewerage on the cost factor. This correspondance will be pulled and sent to all councilmembers.

Mr. Saladino questioned why monies on the 3 parcels have not been received. Mr. Walsh also wished to know why the delay. Mr. Gritzuk also said he did not know why the delay either.

Mr. Punderson made mentioned of an article in the press regarding the closing of inceptors by the Authority. Mr. Gritzuk asked if the Davenport was the one he was referring to. Mr. Punderson said yes. Mr. Gritzuk said it would have to be a revenue producer.

If the Davenport is not built - it would be because of no permit, they may not want to truck the money themselves, wait for grants, have someone else build it. It could be bonded if they could show that the bulk rate be enhanced. They could not build the line, even with the 42 contracts, and increase the bulk rate. More discussion followed. Mr. Walsh said the sewerage plant is carried at \$356,000.00. Mr. Gritzuk said there appears to be a lack of communication somewhere on securing some of the accounting figures. Mr. Walsh will contact Mr. Gorby and see if something could be clarified with the Sewerage Authority auditor Mr. Gross. Mr. Gritzuk said he will have someone look into the problem and try to see where the problem is - in his department or the Boroughs A further discussion took place on the Pine Barren Water Standards which is one factor in the bulk rate factor. Low bids are another factor. Central Service Area may be elible for a 8% grant. Mr. Walsh referred to some of the correspondance received from the Authority. Mr. Gritzuk requested the Council read the file. Another discussion followed. Mayor Saladino thanked Mr. Gritzuk and Mr. Fine and Mr. Siddons for coming and said they would be in touch.

Mr. Gabriel showed plans of the Central Avenue property. It will probably be a half a million ratable. The project will have 2 stores on the first floor with one bedroom apartments on the second floor with a third floor bakeny effect. Professional service have been contacted to rent the first floor stores. The estimated date of construction will be later this month. Mr. Gabriel said these apartments will be high priced.

Mayor Saladino said this information was given just to inform the public. This Mayor and Council had decided that Work meetings are open to the public under the Sunshine Law but the public will not be allowed to participate in the meetings. No formal action will be taken at Work Meetings. Mr. Walsh said Council did not have to take any action of this matter anyhow.

Mayor Saladino read the vouchers for the Water and Sewer Account and some discussion took place on certain ones before they were passed to Mr. Olson for his signature.

Mayor Saladino then read each Current account voucher and again with discussion on some then they were passed to the Councilperson in charge of that voucher.

DISCUSSION FOLLOWED ON THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Water Emergency- Resolution will be drawn up by Mr. Walsh for Friday's meeting to allow watering between the hours of 7:30-9:30 PM.
- 2. Leaf vacumn- Wes Wilber said he went to Vineland and saw the machine and it is in A-1 condition. Mr. Punderson question how it is powered. Wes said it is has a gas motor. This vacumn would be attached to the dump truck.
- 3. Letter from Department of Environmental Protection about June 29th inspection of the wells. Wes Wilber feels since our water is metered when if is filtered. This inspector wants the meter when it comes from the well and also after it is filtered. Wes suggests we wait and see what happens. Mr. Olson to look into the matter.

4. 40A:14-132 - This is a personell problem and since Mr. Murray is not here should be discussed with him and Chief.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mr. Buckley questioned the Post Office hours. Some residents have complained that the box area is not open long enough for them to pick up their mail Mr. Punderson said we have not any control ov er that-send them to the Postmaster Mrs. Stout.

Mrs. Kernaghan requested their be more of a check on Beach badges. There is a rumor that Senior citizens do not need a beach badge. Central Ave. Beach has a problem with one child who is allowed to be at the beach all day without having an adult present. A discussion followed and it was decided that the parent be contacted and told it might become a police matter. Mrs. Kernaghan requested the scuba team go out once more at each beach. Mayor Saladino said to contact George Steer.

Mrs. Asbury suggested having a Clean-Up Week. A complaint was received regarding mosquito problem. It was investigated and found by the Environmental and Misquito commission not to be the case.. Mayor Saladino appointed Mr. Asbury as chairman of a Clean-Up week committee. Mrs. Kernaghan will also be on the committee, with Mrs Buckluf.

Mr. Olson reported the Engineer has been unhappy with the condition of the sewer plant. Mr. Olson agrees with some of the conditions with the plant but he feel the rates for the Water should

be increased. A discussion followed.

Mr. Punderson also expressed a desire to possibly increase the water and sewer rates. Mr. Saladino thought the next speaker maybe could help on some of this. Mr. Saladino introduced Mr. Ronald Juba who gave a report on a GRANT COORINATION COMMITTEE. Their opjective would be to reasearch and aobtain Federal and State monies through available programs. Also to work with the Council in assessing the feasability of application for various available Grants. Mr. Juba contacted Mr. Tony Vaz, Grant Coordinator for Seasifie Heights. They discussed Methods and procedures for obtaining grants, possible regionalization between Seaside Heights, Seaside Park, and Island Heights for obtain certain large scale programs. Specific agencies to contact regarding available monies. He also contacted Paul Murray and Chief Asbury regarding possible crime prevention grant through S.L.E.P.A. Mayor Saladino appointed Mr. Juba and Mr. John Ahannon and George Vesper, to be put on this committee. This will go on Friday night agenda.

Mr. Peter Fujarcyk spoke regarding the work he had done in regard to having Island Heights named as a Historical Town. Mr. Fujarcyk told of all the procedures that were followed to reach this point to have a public hearing on this. Discussion followed regarding how much publicity is needed and how many people would back something like this. Mayor Saladino asked if this had come before the Environmental Commission. Mr. Fujarcyk said he had spoken to the old commission. Mayor Saladino said Ann Blain is the chairman of the Commission, and he suggested that Mr. Fujarcyk contact them and again present this to them so you will act not as an individual.

Mrs. Mc Carthy reported a resident would like to purchase the wicker sofa that is in Holly House. Mr. Walsh said if she were patient possibly other items would be up for sale and at that time she could purchase.

Mrs. Mc Carthy asked for change of hours. Mayor Saladino said Mrs. Mc Carthy has agreed to take her vacation in days and will have every Wednesday for the rest of the summer. Mrs. Mc Carthy would like to have her office open to the public on Monday and Friday from 9:00 AM to 12:00 Noon; Tuesday and Thursday be open from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM; Saturday 10:00AM to 12:00 FM. This way I would be able to complete my work without interruption. Mr. Punderson felt the Clerk should arrange her hours.

Mayor Saladino asked the Chief if he had anything. Chief will wait until Councilman Murray is present.
Police car is having a problem-only 13,000 miles on it and they should take care of it, Wes said.

There being no further business Mayor Saladino adjourned the meeting at 10:10PM

## COMMITTEE REPORTS:

MRS. ASBURY stated the First Aid inventory was complete and copies would be given to Mr. Buckley and the Borough Clerk.

MR. BUCKLEY had been in contact with Mrs. Stout regarding the damage to the P.O. Building. Estimates will be secured. Also Mrs. Stout requested a carpet of some kind be laid in the main lobby for safety in inclement weather. Public Docks at Nelson's Marina are in need of repairs and will contact Wes Wilber in re-

gard to repairing.

MR. OLSON reported we've had very serious problems with our Water and Sewerage system. Mr. Taranto, our water and sewer engineer didn't seem to feel that his recommendations were being carried out. Mr. Murray and I met with Mr. Taranto and measures are being taken to remedy the situation. Fortunately much of it is cosmetic, but we did have to put washed sand in the drying beds. We have had the water tank surveyed and I'm afraid that we will be forced to spend a fair amount of money on the structure-to the point that in the not to distant future we will have to increase our rates as they have not been changed since 1962, while operating costs have soared. The State is less than happy with our system of metering the water we take from the ground. I will discuss this problem with Mr. Taranto and the state officials but I'm very much afraid we are going to be forced to buy a meter.

Mayor Saladino clarified that the meter is for use at the plant and

Mayor Saladino clarified that the meter is for use at the plant and not on homes. Mr. Olson asked at the suggestion of Mr. Wilber of the feasibility of purchasing a used, but in excellent condition, leaf vacumn machine at the purchase price of \$1350.00 which we could pay for in three payment. These machines are normally much higher in cost so considering the value and the problem the leaves present eyery year to all residents. I would like to introduce a Resolution officially authorizing this purchase as we have the necessary funds in the road account to pay for it.

Now to another question that you have all been wondering about for a long time-Cable TV. Since June 21st I've had many meetings with various people from Clear T.V. and while I prefer not to go into a detailed report at this time, as it may prove to be a bit premature, I can assure you cable TV is very close. The telephone company has been working in town the past several weeks re-locating

some of their lines so as to accommodate the Video lines. I will pursue this and hope to have a more definitive report at our next meeting. If you have any questions I'll be glad to try to answer them at this time.

MRS. KERNAGHAN reported the PLANNING BOARD met on July 12th in the Borough Hall. Mr. Thomas Bodine was elected as Chairman and Mr. Robert King was elected as Vice Chairman. The Board voted to rehire Mrs. Laura Kannapes as Secretary for a fee of \$15.00 per meeting. Correspondence was read. Kenneth H. Beck, CTA SMA, Borough Assessor wrote suggesting that in the future all approved subdivision maps be submitted in sets of five with one to the tax office to keep tax records up to date. Al Gabriel presented a proposed office building to be erected at the old borough hall site It would include 12 professional offices and 12 one-bedroom apart-Discussion followed with all members agreeing that the project would be in Island Heights best interest. Discussion then took place regarding the Master Plan. It was decided that the Planning Board would meet two Tuesdays a month; the second and fourth Tuesdays. The fourth Tuesday's meeting would be devoted to the master plan. Residents would be urged to attend these meetings and take part.

MRS. KERNAGHAN reported the BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT met on Tuesday, July 5th in the Borough Hall. Mr. Peter A. Rotolo was elected Chairman. Provisions were made to have Mrs. Laura Kannapes assume more of the legal aspects of the Board and to become Board Secretary instead of Board Clerk. The Board moved to pay Mrs. Kannapes a salary of\$135.00 from July 1st until December 30th, 1977. The following years salary would be #300.00 regardless of the number of meetings. This all would be with the approval of the Council. A public hearing was set for August 2, 1977 for variance applicant J. Lea South, owner of the two store building on the corner of Central and Ocean Avenues. The applicants want to make an upstairs office into a second apartment. Previous owners were refused this request. It was decided that Mr. Richard Walsh, Borough attorney, and Al Gabriel, building inspector should be in attendance for this meeting. The file was given to Mr. Walsh for review.

MRS. KERNAGHAN reported that 283 Recreation Badges were sold, 761 Beach badges for a total of \$4,459.00; 31 keys were sold for \$62.00, making a combined total of \$4,511.00. Mrs. Kernaghan read the report of Mr. Czarniewski on the Summer Recreation Program Mr. CZ stated 6 persons were in the adult tennis program and 14 persons in the children tennis. The <u>Swimming Program</u> had ll in the 4th grade and up group; 28 in the Kindergarten through 3rd grade; and 29 in the Pre-school group for a total of 68 in the programs. ARTS & CRAFTS met every Tuesday and Thursday morning and 54 children were registered. THE 3-MAN ADULT BASKETBALL LEAGUE met Monday and Wednesday evenings and there were 25 men on 5 teams. The first SCAVENGER HUNT had 40 participants. SOCCOR INSTRUCTION every Monday and Thursday for the 3rd grade and under had 15 in the group; and in the 4th grade and over there were 12 in the group that met every evening. GYMNASTICS had 20 participants every Tuesday. BASKETBALL INSTRUCTION FOR YOUNGSTERS had 8 participants and met every Tuesday. One softball game with Ocean Early Childhood Camp, Bricktown was on July 13, 1977 at Bricktown. Mrs. Kernaghan also reported that there was not any water in the South Hall. Mayor Saladino directed Mr. Buckley and Mr. Olson to look into the situation. Mrs. Kernaghan mentioned the need for another fence at the Municipal Tennis Courts and said the Recreation Committee is looking into cost. Mrs. Kernaghan also reported three loads of sand dumped at Long Point but it has not been spread. Mr. Buckley question whom boat ramp keys could be sold to. ordinanced will be checked.

MR. MURRAY received a letter from N.J. A letter of Commendation was sent to the Chief regarding Officer Rubino from Mr. Murray. A letter of Appreciation was sent to the Chief regarding Officer Maybank for giving of his free time to wash and polish car 186. Murray also stated that Officer Maybank, as Safety Officer, has working on the insufficient lighting areas of the borough; Yield Sign on Maple Ave improperly located; Fire Hydrant on River and Jaynes Avenue in particular but all hydrants within the borough should have curb markings within ten feet; Maple and Garden Avenue Stop street sign incorrect height; Yacht Club fire hydrant is not properly marked. ### FOR PUBLIC INFORMATION:

Mr. OLSON read the report from ROBERT L. MERITHEW INC. after the inspection of the tank on July 6, 1977. "The condition of the protective coatings is very poor on both! interior and exterior surfaces of the tank.

The exterior coating is rusting.

With the exception of the top two rings on the tank interior there is no protective coating on the interior surfaces. The top two rings are partially covered with grease and black coating which is probably bitumastic.

I was able to examine the entire ice line and fluctuation level in the tank within the limits of the boson's chair I was working from and found the overall condition of the steel very poor with pit readings recorded as deep as 3/16 of an inch. I doubt if the original wall thickness was more than 1/4 inch which leaves very little metal intact. I counted just over 100 repair weld spots in 1 plate in the third ring. Extensive repairs including seal welding of the plate edges have been undertaken during the life of this tank.

The bird screen is partially missing and the shell to roof support brackets are in poor condition although the roof is in no immediate danger of structual failure.

Considering the age and overall condition of the tank it is my recommendation that maintenance work would not be feasible and it is very possible that sandblasting would blow thru the existing upper shell walls.

Normal maintenanace on this tank would cost approximately \$1800.00 for sandblasting and painting the interior and exterior surfaces to the grade of Near-White Metal and a 4 coat vinyl system inside and 3 coat alkyd system outside. Repair work that is now required in addition to the possibility of extensive welding after sandblasting could easily add an additional \$7000.00 to the above figure. I would question this expenditure of money on a tank this

old insofar as anticipated service life after maintenance.

Color photographs are enclosed: List is given.

Photographs 9 thru 17 are all of the interior tank shell taken at different locations. Rust, rust scale and small amounts of defective coating are present. The steel is badly etched with numerous pits and the overall condition of the rivet heads is poor from the fourth ring down."

This is a summary of our visual inspection of the above tank and our budget prices to complete any of the work.

As you know the tank was not inspected by us, other than a visual inspection, by our supervisors Tom Vaughn and George Brooks while they were making emergency repairs. No pit readings were taken by pit gauges, no plugs were cut to determine the plate thick ness, or any paint thickness readings taken.

Based on our visual inspection the following is noted:

- . Foundation is cracked.
- 2. Shell (exterior) is rusting.
- 3. Shell (interior) is rusting.
- Roof inside and out is rusting.
- 5. Shell connection to roof is bad, most of the connecting clips are bad, about half of them are rusted through and serves no purpose at all, and the remainder are very heavily corroded.

  SPECIAL NOTE: The roof as far as Corrosion Control Corp. is concerned is UNSAFE.
- 6. Vent screen between roof and shell needs repair.

7. Shell ladder needs to be inspected thoroughly.

Our price to repair the roof connection by welding all new 3/8 steel clips (same as existing), and make repairs to screen, by replacing bad screen with new (same as existing), is lump sum (firm price)

Out of approximately 800 questionnaires, we received about 150 returns. We urgently request that all taxpayers complete their forms and turn them in to the Borough Clerk. As soon as sll the results are tabulated, they will be posted.

Mrs. Kernaghan requested that Mr. Rotolo give the Zoning Board of Adjustment Report.

MR. PETER ROTOLO reported that in July the Board reorganized and appointed Peter A. Rotolo as Chairperson, and Mrs. Ruth Mayer as Vice Chairperson. In addition, the Borough Clerk was appointed as its secretary.

In August an appeal was heard from J. Lea South Inc., requesting a "special use" variance to authorize one additional residential apartment in a commercial zoned area, above the two stores on the corner of Central and Ocean /venue. The Appeal was denied.

In September the Board secretary, Mrs. Laura Kannapes submitted her resignation. The Borough Council appointed the Borough Clerk, Mrs. Elsiemae Mc Carthy as the new secretary for three months to be effective October 1977.

In October an appeal was heard from Mr. & Mrs. Peter Kier requesting a variance for insufficient set back from the property line at 109 Oak Avenue. The Appeal was granted.

- MRS. KERNAGHAN gave the following Recreation Commission report:
  1. Swimming and Open Gymnasium at Ocean County College for the two October Sundays: 120 persons attended.
- 2. Girls Gymnastics has started for the elementary children, Two groups have alsready visited Gymnastic team meets between Toms River South and Central and Toms River South and Jackson High.
- 3. Boys Wrestling Program is in the planning stages now, with meets scheduled with other Recreation Centers and A.A.U. Meet, Brick Recreation Tournament and Point Pleasant Recreation Tournamont. Boy wrestling will start around December 15 and run until March 15.

- 4. 40 participants took part in the 2nd Annual Island Heights Golf Tournament held on Saturday, October 1st at Ocean Acres Country Club, Manahawkin. 'This years event was chaired by Dave Siddons. The 3rd Annual Spring Tournment will be chaired by Bob and Carol Wixsor.
- 5. Halloween Costume Contest will be held on Sunday, October 30th at 6:00p.m. at the school activity room-all age groups are welcome. Refreshments will be served.

The Recreation Commission would like some input from the Senior citizens regarding the types of programs and activities that they are interested in so that something can be done for them.

The Hawks Soccer team would like to use the Complex grounds of the first two Sundays in November from 12 noon. Bathroom facilities are not needed.

MRS. ASBURY reported Rabies Clinic was held recently at the Borough Garage. 19 dogs, 2 puppies and 2 cats were vaccinated.

The Flu program was a hugh success.  $143\ \mathrm{elderly}\ \mathrm{persons}$  attended.

The OUTREACH PROGRAM has been contacted and on Thursdays our people will be taken to St. Andrews Church for a hot lunch for a charge of 60¢ and then they will be taken shopping. Anyone wishing to participate in this program may contact Mrs. Tracey at 349-0314 before 9:30a.m. and state they would like to participate in this program. Arrangements would then be made to pick them up at their house.

John Robinson gave pitures, he took, of the Organization meeting of the governing body. I made up a letter from Mayor and Counci and if everyone would sign it Paul will give it to Mr. Robinson.

Mayor had asked me to design a little booklet for information of for all citizens in town in reference to members of Council, committee etc and their meeting dates. I went to printer and for 850 sheets-if we fold them ourself we could save \$90.00 - it would cost \$56.70; for 1000 sheets it would be \$59.00.

A. C.E.T.A. Funding - Restoration and Creation of Recreational Areas

The grant applied for on 8/31/77 for \$14,051 to implement the above project was rated and approved by C.E.TA. and sent to the Citizens Advisory Board for their further approval. This panel tabled the project until January of 1978 with the suggestion that approval be given and the program funded at that time.

B. S.L.E.P.A. Funding - Detection, Deterrence and Apprehension Activities Involving Direct Law Enforement Functions

The final stages of preparing this application for a \$20,000 grant are now being made. Valuable assistance by Chief Asbury and Councilman Murray has been afforded to this committee for the finalization of this application.

C. N.J. Department of Transportation Mini Bus Grant As An Aid To Senior Citizens and Any Infirm or Handicapped Person.

"Dear Mr. Punderson:

You have asked me for an opinion pertaining to a \$5,000.00 voucher submitted for accumulated vacation and sick leave by a retired Borough official who served from February 1, 1961 through December 31, 1976. During this period she served simultaneously as Tax Collector, Treasurer, Tax Search Officer and Clerk of Public Works. None of the above were full-time positions and at least one, that of Tax Collector, was elective and gave her tenure in office.

I note that no documentation was received to substantiate that she did not take vacation or sick days, the voucher merely recites:

"Vacation: 2 yrs. @ 5 days 10 days 8 " @ 10 " 80 " 6 " @ 15 " 90 "

Sick Leave:

60 '' 240 ''

The ordinance governing vacations and sick leave (Chapter 27-Personnel Policies) as originally adopted in 1957 granted these benefits only to Hourly Wage Employees. An amendment on March 23, 1973 conferred these benefits on salaried employees and our present ordinance was adopted on March 26, 1976.

If she was a salaried employee from Februaryl, 1961 to March 23, 1973, she would not be entitled to the requested benefits. If she were an hourly wage employee during that period she would not be entitled to vacation time since it was not accumulative and sick time accumulation could not exceed seven (7) days.

Erom March 23, 1973 to March 26, 1976 (three years) she would be entitled to ladays per month vacation which "must be taken within a two-year period", and ladays per month sick leave. Thus, she would be entitled to take forty-five vacation days and forty-five sick days during that period.

From March 26, 1976 until her retirement (nine months) she would have been entitled to take 15 vacation days and 8 sick days.

It is my opinion that the sick day accumulation for the foregoing periods lapsed upon her voluntary retirement which was not related to illness. Of the pre-March 1976 vacation time she would be entitled to the previous one year's accumulation or fifteen days, the balance having lapsed because it was not taken within a two-year period. The post-March 1976 vacation time also lapsed because the new ordinance (Section 27-2C) prohibits accrual into any successive year.

Thus, she should be paid for 15 days vacation time upon the totality of her salaries divided by a 260-day year in accordance with the Salary Ordinance in effect in 1975."

MR. DECAMP asked when voucher was dated. WALSH: Date of the request was February 1977. The opinion was dated October 5, 1977.

MR DE CAMP said he thought Mrs. Wilberscheid resigned December 31, 1976. She offered her time gradis to help train the new people. MAYOR SALADINO said Mrs. Wilberscheid worked the month of January and she was remunerated for her time.

MR. DE CAMP That's what I was trying to get at. That you did right by her.

MR. OLSON said this coming Monday we will start a regular, continui effort to pick up your leaves starting from West End Ave and workin to the Eastward. Piles of leaves will receive priority as they are easier to pick up; however the machine encounters difficulty picking up extremely wet leaves so if you will try to turn your leaves over to day and try to contain them in a pile, this program will work better.

Our last water and sewer installation made me very much aware of the inadequary of some of our work methods and equipment Our men worked for hours with sledge hammer and star drill to knock a hole in concrete so we are looking into a mechanical jack hammer and a small used scoop for the back hoe which will made a much neater opening in the street and save much time and money. The present back hoe scoop will at times rip up five and six foot sections of asphalt which necessatiates a lot of patching and looks awful when finished.

A mechanical jack hammer will probably run around \$1700.00 but will save so much in man hours spent on a job. I don't suppose a narrow used scoop will be too much money. I'll have more on that in a later report.

By now you should all have been contacted by Clear Cable TV regarding hook-up. The pre-amplifiers are being installed right now and we should be in operation within thirty days. I would urge again that you take advantage of the free hook-up and try the cable. If you are less then happy it cost nothing to have it turned off. Thank yoù!

Mesdames and Gentlemen:

I have been asked to reply to you concerning your recent request of the Governing Body to take action upon and/or to rescind an alleged improper building permit issued by Mr. Gabriel in a commercial area.

The controlling statute, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-72, states as follows:

"Appeals and applications to board of adjustment.
A. Appeals to the board of adjustment may be taken by any interested party affected by any decision of an administrative officer of the municipality based on or made in the enforcement of the zoning ordinance or official map. Such appeal shall be taken within 65 days by filing a notice of appeal with the officer from whom the appeal is taken specifying the grounds of such appeal. The officer from whom the appeal is taken shall immediately transmit to the board all the papers constituting the record upon which the action appealed from was taken."

Appeals to the Governing Body may only be taken from the final decision of the Board of Adjustment or Planning Board (N.J.S.A. 40:55D-17).

The aforementioned statutes are meant to grant independence from political interference by the Governing Body with either Mr. Gabriel or the Zoning and Planning Boards before and during the course of their decision making power.

In my opinion, therefore, the Governing Body has no jurisdiction to act in this matter because there is no valid appeal before it from the granting of the permit.

President John Klagholz and David Siddons spoke of the enrollment and the need for building growth. Debt Service will be over in 1983. If Lacey Township withdraws, 45 teachers will be cut from 175 now employed.

Privilege of floor given to MiLES DE CAMP. Discussion followed on increase percentage and impact on the budget using 1977-78 budget figures. Mr. Klagholz said if the referendum is passed, by July 1, 1978 Lacey Township would be in a sending-receiving situation. Mr Punderson questioned percentage of housing in Berkeley Township that is seniors and Mr. Crowley answered percentage will be higher due to new development and they will also have some school producing homes built.

When questioned by Joan Roberts on how long it would be before Lacey left the district, Mr. Klagholz answered within 9 months after the referendum is passed. But it could take 5 or 6 years, or

at least 4 years to build.

Discussion followed regarding enrollment and increase is about 765 a year, triple sessions; transporting to other districts; loss of Lacey member on Central Board. For Klagholz enswered no triple session; at this point there would be no sending of students to other districts but it was alway a possibility. Mr. Siddons then lead a discussion on 5% increase of students in the next year and a financial impact on a \$20,000.00 house in each district was given. Mr. Klagholz discussed an increase in education aspects with Lacey withdrawal due to less student population and single sessions. Lunch room facilities were also discussed and Central's lunch program is said to be self-supporting. Discussion followed on abstract of rateables; probability of voting down the withdrawal. Mr. (rowley, Mr. Siddons and Dr. Smith were in favor of the withdrawal.

MAYOR SALADINO thanked everyone for coming and helping Island Haight residents make a decision on their voting. Island Haights Board of Education members left at 8:50 p.m. and Central Regional members left five minutes later.

There seems to be some question as to working records of our Borough employees. Please let me read to you the following memo from our clark: (see attached)

Ilwell realize that in an effort to do a good job some of my fellow councilmen and women have programs they would like implement However I would like to point out that in the operation of our small family business I have forty employees and yet I'm expected to run the town which is a multi mil) ion dollar operation with six men. One man is assigned to water/sewerage and technically Wes is supervisor, altho he to works very hard but this really leaves may a work force of four men to patch the roads, take care of public grounds, al' these old buildings, water/sewer hook-ups. They are painters, masons, mechanics, plumbers, carpenters! So under these conditions you can only operate on priority basis - public health and safety first. This means keeping the police car running. The

trucks and necessary equipment in top order so it doesn't leave much time left for the thousand and one small jobs that seemingly go neglected. I'm sorry for this condition but see no other solution with the limited crew I have at my disposal.

Be closing I have one more item. We were treated to a demonstration of a 53 lb. gasoline driven jack hammer. It was beautiful-rith it a job that I saw our employees spend all day on could have been done in fifteen minutes and a much neater job. We are getting a price on a slightly used demonstrator.
