ORDINANCE 2021-05

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ISLAND HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY ALLOWING THE BOROUGH TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK IN KEEPING WITH N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A 40A: 4-45.14 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to the cost of living adjustment declared by the State of New Jersey (1.0%) unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions, and;

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years, and;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Island Heights finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2021 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens, and;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 2.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$58,919.73 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary, and;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Island Heights, a majority of the full authorized membership of the governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2021 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Island Heights shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 2.5%, amounting to \$58,919.73, and that the CY 2021 municipal budget for the Borough of Island Heights be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance, and;

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years, and;

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction, and;

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon; be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

DISCUSSION & PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Tara Church – Our Borough, through the work of our Environmental Committee has been recognized for achievement as a small town by Sustainable New Jersey and we have been recertified at Silver Status which was first achieved in 2017. The award that the Borough achieved was presented by Ms. Church to the Mayor and Council to be displayed in the Borough Offices and on our television channel.

Lucy Sheer worked to help the Borough receive a \$500 grant to pay for plantings in the Borough and particularly on Earth Day, April 24^{th.}

The new drain and curbing installed on West End Avenue last year has caused flooding in front of my property on West End Avenue.

Mr. Gabriel – We will investigate the drainage issue on West End Avenue.

GOVERNING BODY REPORTS

Mr. Fumo – Our Elementary School students are back to in person learning five days a week and the regular State Testing will occur this year. Parents and students have been reminded that if they travel out of State over the Spring Break they must quarantine for ten days.

Mr. Weber – The First Aid Squad will be having their Annual Flower Sale over the Easter Weekend. Gary Stocco passed his State Exam and is now a Licensed EMT.

The Fire Company responded to the recent brush fire in Ocean County and did a great job, terrific teamwork among all of the first responders.

Our Police Department issued 83 summonses for the month of January and 67 in February, primarily for traffic violations and speed enforcement has been a focus.

April is autism awareness month.

Mr. Gabriel – DPW has been a bit short handed due one ill employee and one on paternity leave.

Our roll off truck has been down for major repairs which slows down the hauling of our recycling bins and yard waste to the County.

DPW installed new crosswalk signs in the area of our school to improve safety for pedestrians.

A new sign was installed by DPW on the side of our Post Office.

The brush fire that our Fire Company responded to recently was a very dangerous situation and a real threat to persons and property. In all, forty seven fire companies responded and two commercial buildings suffered severe damage. Our Fire Company worked to protect residential areas by controlling hot spots keeping the fire from spreading. We thank all of those who give of their time in this way to keep us all safe.

Ms. Pendleton – Our Community Garden has two beds left for this season, contact the Borough Office for details.

Our Recreation Committee will be running an Easter Egg Hunt on March 27th at 10 AM. The Committee will be meeting on April 27th to begin planning for the spring and summer.

Our Board of Health and other volunteers have been working to get COVID vaccination appointments for our residents in need with great success.

We continue to seek vendors for a Farmers Market this summer and any interested vendors should contact me through the Borough Office.

Congratulations to our Environmental Committee Members for all of their achievements that were announced this evening.

Mayor Doyle – No dogs are permitted on the Boardwalk which is from the curb on River Avenue to the River Edge.

The speeding on River Avenue is being addressed by our Police Department. It is a County Road and they set the speed limit, not the Borough.

Our residents are very excited to see the COVID situation winding down with some return to normalcy, please do everything to continue to stay safe.

In addition to a new sign our Post Office has received flooring, lighting and new paint. We are still working on improving customer service with the Postal Service.

Yesterday was World Water Day, we should be thankful to our DPW staff for the operation of our great water system.
