Mr. Tavares: Fighter Creek Plant Evacuation practice drill to be held on March 16, 1982. All areas within a ten mile radius are to be included in this drill. Mr. Gabriel, Mr. Wilbur & Mr. Andersen represented the Fire Co. and Mr. Tavares representing Council attended the training program. The Police Dept and First Aid Squad were not represented. All Depts should be in attendance for the next session. Mrs. Martin: No Report

Mr. Johnson: Water & Sewer, the filter media is in the process of being changed and we are waiting for the strainers to come in. We are still having numerous sewer problem and the pump stations are still giving us problems. The Boro men are out chopping ice and sanding the roads, vechile maintance is still continuing. Mayor Bloom had one addition to this report later in the meeting I will recommend that Mr. George Althouse be appointed as our W-2 Water operator.

Mr. Lenox: ADHOC committee will meet next week to discuss plans for the Boro Hall and the complex buildings. Mr. Lenox then turned over the Gypsy Moth information portion to Mrs. Asbury.

Mrs. Asbury: The Gypsy Moth Commission met yesterday, the egg mass survey taken by the State indicates that we are eligble to take part in the State's program for spraying. The Boro is obligated to send a letter to property owners 21 days prior to the spray, bee keeper have to be notified. The State's reimbursement to the Boro will be about \$2.00 per acre. approx. 12% of the cost. The area west of Oak Avenue is not included in the spray area, the Boro will look into having the rest of the Boro sprayed by a private contractor. The approx. cost for spraying the 165 acres is \$1,402.50. The Mayor has included in this evenings adgenda to vote that funds be made available in the 1982 appropations. The Mayor thanked Mrs. Asbury for her forsight in this matter. Dover Twsp. is also participating in the spray program.

Mayor Bloom asked if any members of Council had any questions on the sale of the stone from the abandoned sewer plant. Mrs. Martin asked to be brought up to date on what was going on.

Mayor Bloom quetes so we could clear the land at the sewer plant so we could use the area for leages, rid the area of possible contaminates, and prepare the land for sale possibly next year. The property was abandon in May of 1981, by the Boro. Mayor Bloom sold the stone to the lowest bidder on an estimate of 400 Ton the bid was \$2,700. our cost to remove the stome. Mrs. Martin asked if the stone would be valuable for projects, ex. Camp Walk, Boy Scout Is. Mayor Bloom assured her that the stones were of no value and could not be used for those projects, and 7 loads of stones had already been dumped at Boy Scout Is. Mayor Bloom stated that we had only one party interested in buying the stones. Mrs. Martin asked if we should have advertised that we had this stone for sale, Mayor Bloom assured Mrs. Martinethat the general public would not be able to use the stone due to contamination. Mrs. Hansen asked then how can we use this stone on Boy Scout Is. Mayor Bloom noted we are waiting for a reply from the DEP, Mr. Tavares ordered 7 loads delivered to Boy Scout Is. and we are waiting to see if we can use them. Mayor Bloom the contractor brought 23 loadseat \$50. for a total of \$1.150.00., the

buyer was Alantic Coast Paving resold to the contractors of the Condo's.

Mrs. Asbury stated that the beds are to deep for compose beds, Mrs. Asbury was also in touch with the Coastal Project Review and the permit the Boro has is still good until Dec. 31, 1982, but the permit from the state has not been renewed, so in order to dump the stone the permit must be renewed. Before the stone can be spread it must be tested by the Ocean County Health Dept.

Mr. Gabriel questioned the sale of contaminated stone to the public, Mayor Bloom assured Mr. Gabriel that the stone had been treated by Mr. Rudnicki, a licensed operator, also that the contractor brought the stone at his own risk. Mrs. Martin asked if we had a letter to that affect, and when actually was the stone sold.

Mr. Lenox agreed that it was a good deal.

Mr. Johnson, if we had to take the loads to Boy Scout Is. it would have taken us 3 times as long.

Mayor Bloom noted that we had a licensed operator treat the stones, if there is a problem Mr. John Rudnicki would be responsible. Mayor Bloom suggested that we table the sale of any more stone all members of Council were in favor.

Central Ave. Pavilion

Mayor Bloom thanked Mr. Gabriel and Mr. Giuliano for being present, Mayor Bloom asked Mr. Gabriil to give his opinion first.

Mr. Gabriel stated he would like plans & specs and a bottom line figure for the project, and what work the contractor is going to do.

Mr. Giuliano, had a on site meeting with Mr. Caldwell, the southerly end has been rotted by water, 4 concrete caps to be poured 5 feet deep, wood beam would be replaced with a steel eye beam, as Mr. Giuliano sees it that would be the extent of Mr. Caldwell's work. Mayor Bloom asked Mike if he were pleased with what Mr. Caldwell has planned for the pavilion, Mr. Giuliano stated that he could not certify this job. Mr. Walsh asked what the projected cost would be it cannot exceed \$4,500. Mayor Bloom stated that he contacted 3 contractors who gave quotes for \$60,000.,\$22,000. and \$4,300.00.

Mr. Gabriel questioned the three quotes, also who was going to work on the other bearing points, the Mapor assured Mr. Gabriel that the only problem was on the south side of the pavilion. The Mayor stated that his number one concern is fixing that building. Mr. Gabriel again asked for a bottom line figure on completation, the Mayor gave the figure of \$4,500.00 to square it off and another \$600. for flooring. Mr. Gabriel asked who would complete the job once Caldwell is finished, the Mayor answered Borough Employees and Volunteer Workers. Mayor Bloom has made up his mind that he would leave the decission up to the Council. The building is presently on a stop work order.

Mayor Bloom asked if there were any questions from Council:

Mrs. Asbury questioned we do not have in writing how much Mr. Caldwell is going to charge, she has no objections just so the work does not exceed the \$4,500.00 limit. Mrs. Hansen asked Mr. Gabriel what his recommendation would be for the next step. Mr. Gabriel replied he would like to see specs and plans to protect the public. Mr. Johnson asked Mr. Giuliano how deep would the cement go, Mr. Giuliano explained the problems with the southerly corner. Mr. Giuliano stated that he was not certifing this job but it is ok if he does what he said he would do. Mr. Caldwell said he would supply a sketch of what he intends to do, Mr. Gabriel was asked if that would satisfy his requirements.

Mrs. Hansen asked Mr. Giuliano how much plans and specs would cost no less than \$1,000.00. Engineer costs could run 100% of the project cost.Mrs. Martin read the letter from Mayor Bloom relieving Mr. Gabriel of his responsibilities on the Pavilion. Mrs. Martin stated this letter was written without the knowledge of Council. Discussion followed between Mrs. Martin and Mayor Bloom. Mrs Martin stated she is still upset with the letter, Mayor Bloom the letter was repealed last nite, Mr. Gabriel stated it was not. Discussion followed between Mr. Gabriel over the responsibility of the Pavalion.

Mr. Lenox took time to review the events presently a stop work order is in effect, Mr. Gabriel feels he would like plans, specs and a bottom line figure on the Pavilion. Mr. Giuliano has reviewed the project he is satisfied with Mr. Caldwell's plans on the project will be satisfactory, but will not certify. There has been an agreement that Mr. Caldwell supply a sketch pf what he is going to do.

Mayor Bloom said that they bid very poorly, Mrs. Asbury stated that our Specs were poor, she stated that we should have had seperate specs for each model. A long discussion followed.
