ORDINANCE 2024-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ISLAND HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING AUTHORITY TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.14 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to the cost of living adjustment declared by the State of New Jersey (2.5%) unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Island Heights in the County of Ocean finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$25,311.39 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Island Heights, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2024 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Island Heights shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 1.00%, amounting to \$25,311.39, and that the CY 2024 municipal budget for the Borough of Island Heights be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

MAYOR DOYLE INTRODUCED THE COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS:

Mr. Fumo – Our Fire Company responded to nine calls in the Borough in the month of March. Their Fire Boat has been launched and is back in service. Summerbrew is scheduled for June 29th and will be back at the Fire Company property.

Our First Aid Squad has responded to fifty two calls for service year to date. The Squad continues to seek volunteers to serve as drivers and EMTs.

Our Recreation Committee is working on a schedule of summer activities that will include our July 4th bike parade.

Mr. Baxter – Our Planning Board will be meeting on Thursday for the second time this year and we now have multiple applications pending. Our managers and elected and appointed officials are in the process of filing our annual financial disclosures, they are due by April 30th.

Mr. Gabriel – Our Police Department Pickup had some electrical issues while on an accident scene. The company that installed the lights will be coming to headquarters to make repairs. Recent turnover in our Police Department is to be expected as Officers move on to full time opportunities or decide that they want to work in a larger department.

Ms. Pendleton – Our water main replacement project on Lake Drive is getting underway and should last four to six weeks.

Our DPW Director is interviewing for part time seasonal employees.

DPW continues to walk our boardwalk daily to check for any loose or warped boards, they are addressed immediately.

A new water system is being installed at the Community Garden and should be in operation by the end of April.

DPW is getting underway with the weeding and mulching of our garden beds and in the next two weeks we will begin planting new shade trees on Borough property.

Ms. Thompson – Our thanks to DPW for their work to update the water system at our Community Garden. Members will also be installing new chicken wire around the fence line to protect the garden from animal intruders.

Our Environmental Committee will be celebrating Earth Day on Saturday, April 20th the Wanamaker Complex. There will be a classroom instructional on composting and giveaways of native plants along with cleanup initiatives, all are welcome.

Fred DeFeo stepped aside as chair of the committee so Tanara Hall will act as chairperson for the remainder of 2024.

Mayor Doyle – Our insurance carrier is offering a training program for elected officials and for each member of the Governing Body who completes the training our insurance premium will be reduced by \$250.00.

Our infrastructure work will continue through the summer and road work will restart in the fall with five Borough roads being paved in September.
