ORDINANCE 2025-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ISLAND HEIGHTS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK IN KEEPING WITH N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.14 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to the cost of living adjustment declared by the State of New Jersey (2.5%) unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2025 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$26,650.04 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Island Heights, in the County of Ocean, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Island Heights shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 1.00%, amounting to \$26,650.04, and that the CY 2025 municipal budget for the Borough of Island Heights be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

MAYOR DOYLE INTRODUCED THE COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS:

Ms. Healy – At Central Regional High, the J.R.O.C. Ball took place earlier in the month to recognize the leaders and student volunteers.

At our Elementary School, the two sessions of pre-school to start in September are now full, you can contact the school to place your child on a waiting list in the event of later vacancies.

Mr. Fumo – Our Fire Company answered seventeen calls for service in February and conducted three training drills which included training at homes in the Borough that are scheduled for demolition. The company participated in the St. Patrick's Day Parade and the Polar Plunge in Seaside Heights.

Our First Aid Squad has responded to thirty five calls year to date. They have moved into their new headquarters on Lake Avenue. They will be conducting their annual flower sale over the Easter Weekend.

Mr. Gabriel – Our Police Department now has an Officer designated as Detective effective on March 15th, congratulations to Officer D'Amico-Violante.

The Department continues to seek Class II Officers for the summer, a posting is active.

The Department issued fifty eight summons in February following one hundred six motor vehicle stops.

Mr. Baxter – Our Planning Board will meet this Thursday; they have a Resolution regarding a subdivision to consider.

Our Municipal Court has gross revenue of \$4,200.00 year to date with the next Court on April 14th.

Mr. Pendleton – Our DPW is busy assisting with the water meter replacement project, shutting off water at various locations so that work may proceed.

Several pumps have needed replacement at our water plant over the past month.

DPW has been dealing with graffiti at our Central Avenue Pavilion and cleaning our storm drains with the recent heavy rains.

DPW erected a raptor perch near the community garden and the playground equipment their was repaired and painted.

On April 26th, our Environmental Committee will be celebrating Earth and Arbor Days at the Wanamaker Complex with giveaways of seeds and plants and a cleanup throughout the Borough, please come out and join the volunteers.

Our Cultural and Heritage Association will be continuing their lecturer series at the Ocean County Artists Guild Headquarters on April 21st at 7 PM. The topic will be submarine activity off of our coast during World War II.

Mr. Weber – Along with several other Council Members, I attended the Grand Opening of the new Island Heights Bagelry on February 22^{nd} . There was a great turnout by our residents and the food was excellent, best of luck to this new restaurant.

In our Construction Office, our inspectors have completed 125 inspections so far this year to protect the safety of our property owners. The Office has processed 64 building and subcode permits for work being done on commercial and residential properties in the Borough.

Our Code Enforcement Office has completed nine occupancy certificate inspections to date as well as seven zoning permit reviews. The Office wants to remind everyone that our Recreation Badges are being sold at the discounted price of \$20.00 through April 30th, on May 1st the price will increase to \$25.00. Over 250 Recreation Badges have already been sold.

Mayor Doyle – We are in the process of obtaining quotes for the repair of our boardwalk that was damaged by a motorist.

The new fencing at the Memorial Field courts is completed, now both the tennis and basketball courts are fenced.

The Holly Avenue and Lake Drive road improvement project is essentially finished, the contractor will be returning to complete a few punch list items.

I want to recognize Councilman Fumo, he volunteered and completed the installation of new tile flooring at the new First Aid Squad Headquarters, our thanks for this generation donation of time.
